SCOUTING THE BADGERS: Wisconsin, which is currently ranked 14th in the USCHO Preseason Poll, was selected to finish in a fourth-place tie with fellow Wildcat opponent Minnesota in the 2008-09 Preseason WCHA Coaches' Poll... The Badgers were an overtime goal away from a Frozen Four bid during the 2007-08 season and this year, they open with Boston College on Friday night before heading north to Durham on Saturday night... Wisconsin returns 20 of its 26 letterwinners from the 2007-08 season, including its goaltenders... Wisconsin also returns five of its top six scorers from last season... The returning group of five accounted for 49 goals, 80 assists and 129 points. In total, 87 out of 114 goals (76.3 percent), 135 out of 201 assists and 222 out of 315 points will return to the Badger lineup (70.5 percent) for 2008-09.

SERIES HISTORY VS. WISCONSIN: Wisconsin owns a 14-2 advantage in 16 all-time meetings dating back to March 25, 1977... The Badgers won the first 14 meetings, three of which were in overtime... UNH has held the advantage of late posting 16 goals in the last two meetings, both wins for the Wildcats... UNH is 1-3 at home, 0-8 on the road and 1-3 in neutral site games... Coach Umile in his 19-year coaching career has registered a 2-1 mark against the Badgers... In the last meeting, UNH captured a 7-4 win over Wisconsin on March 28, 1998 in the first round of the NCAA East Regional in Albany, N.Y.

EXHIBIT A: 'DOWNRIGHT OFFENSIVE': The Wildcat offense posted eight goals in their 8-4 exhibition win over St. Francis Xavier on Oct. 4... James van Riemsdyk, Peter LeBlanc and Phil DeSimone each recorded three points... LAST TIME THESE TEAMS MET (3/28/98): The last time UNH and Wisconsin met was at the East Regional in Albany, N.Y... The Badgers jumped out to a 3-1 lead in that game, but UNH answered with six-straight goals and went on to earn the 7-4 win.

THE 'CATS ON OPENING NIGHT: UNH opens its 82nd season. The 'Cats own a 43-37-1 all-time record on opening night... The Wildcats are 2-3-1 vs. WCHA teams in the first game of the season, including a 2-0-1 mark over the last three... UNH opened with a win over Colorado College in 2006, downed Ohio State in 2004 and skated to a tie with North Dakota in 2000... In Coach Umile's 18 seasons as head coach, the team is 14-3-1 on opening night.

CONKLIN, O'CONNOR INDUCTED INTO WILDCAT HALL OF FAME:

Ty Conklin '01 and David O'Connor '66 were recently inducted into the UNH Wildcat Hall of Fame. Ty Conklin was one of the Wildcats' most successful and recognized goalies while here in Durham and after in the NHL. As a result of his outstanding efforts he became UNH's second two-time finalist (top 10) for the Hobey Baker Award in 2000 and 2001. The Hockey East Co-Player of the year in 1999-2000, he recorded a 2.51 goals against average and a .908 save percentage, but then topped that with five shutouts, a 2.05 GAA and a .920 save percentage the next year. O'Connor was named the recipient of the Leitzel Award, which is given to a person who has made key contributions to the lives of UNH student-athletes. O'Connor was an assistant coach for men's hockey from 1976 until 1987 and he was the interim head coach of men's hockey from 1987-88. He also served as a long-time assistant football coach for the Wildcats starting in 1972 and worked for 18 years under head coach Bill Bowes. O'Connor was also an outstanding player for the Wildcats in both sports, playing defensive back for the football team and defense on the Wildcat hockey team before he graduated from UNH in 1966.

CAPTAINS ANNOUNCED: Greg Collins and Joe Charlebois were named the 102nd and 103rd captains in the history of UNH hockey for the 2008-09 season. The announcement was made on April 19 at the annual team awards banquet at the Whittemore Center. Collins was also the recipient of the Warren Brown Award for the second-straight season, given annually to the best defensive forward on UNH's roster, and earned the Robert Kullen Award as the unsung hero of the Wildcats in 07-08. Collins, who tallied 11 points (4g, 7a) in 36 games last season for the 'Cats, recorded a multiple-point night with a goal and an assist against North Dakota on Dec. 29. Charlebois was named Hockey East's Best Defensive Defenseman. He registered a career-high nine points on a goal and eight assists in 38 games this season. Charlebois' +26 plus/minus rating was tops on the team.

WILDCATS PICKED THIRD IN HOCKEY EAST POLL: UNH was picked third in the Hockey East preseason Coaches' Poll, which was announced Sept. 29 at the league's annual media day at Legends Restaurant at the TD Banknorth Garden. The Wildcats garnered 78 points in the poll and received one first-place vote, which was good enough for third place, outdistancing fourth-place Northeastern by 16 points. UNH was just eight points behind defending National Champion Boston College (86) and two behind Boston University (80). The 'Cats have captured back-to-back regular-season titles by posting a combined 37-12-5 record in league play over the past two seasons, including a program-best 19 wins last season.

HOME SWEET HOME: UNH finished its 13th season of play at the Whittemore Center in 2007-08, posting a final record of 14-4-1 at Towse Rink...UNH owns a 170-48-19 all-time record in 13 seasons of play at the Whittemore Center with 154 sellouts during that time in 237 all-time games.

THE DICK UMILE ERA: Dick Umile, a five-time Hockey East Coach of the Year, enters his 19th season as the head coach of the UNH Wildcats. He recently earned his fourth Leonard Fowle New England Coach of the Year award. After signing a long-term contract in 2000, Umile will conclude his coaching career at his alma mater. During his time spent at UNH, Umile has molded UNH hockey into one of the top programs in all of Division I hockey, guiding the Wildcats to four Frozen Four appearances, 14 NCAA tournament appearances and 18 Hockey East championship tournament showings in his 18-year career in Durham. In addition, Umile has posted 16 20-victory campaigns over the span of 18 seasons, including a current streak of 12 20-win seasons and back-to-back 25-plus win seasons. Umile is now the winningest coach in the history of UNH hockey with 424 career victories. He surpassed legendary coach Charlie Holt on Feb. 16, 2005 in a 6-1 victory at Merrimack at Thom Lawler Arena in North Andover, Mass. Umile ranks third among active NCAA coaches with a .653 winning

percentage and on the active victories list his 424 victories ranks eighth among NCAA coaches. He has been named Coach of the Year a total of 10 times in his career, including New England honors four times. Umile's five Hockey East Coach of the Year Awards is an all-time league best. Last season Umile led the Wildcats to a 25-10-3 record, including a program-record 19 Hockey East wins en route to a 19-5-3 record in league play, which earned UNH the regular season title for the second season in a row. Umile captured his 400th career victory Oct. 19, 2007 against Boston University. Umile coached four All-Americans in Kevin Regan, Mike Radja, Matt Fornataro, and Brad Flashains, which was the first time in school history that four players received that honor.

FORWARD THINKING: The Wildcats have a very strong core of returning forwards led by seniors Greg Collins (Fairport, N.Y.), Thomas Fortney (Webster Groves, Mo.) and Jerry Pollastrone (Revere, Mass.). Collins is one of two Wildcat captains for 2008-09. He was the recipient of the Warren Brown Award for the second straight season in 2007-08, given annually to the best defensive forward on UNH's roster, and also earned the Robert Kullen Award as the unsung hero of Wildcats in 07-08. Collins has tallied 11 points (4g, 7a) in 36 games this season playing on the third line. Another returner from the third line, a line with a tenacious reputation, is Fortney. Fortney, who was the recipient of the Ironman Award for best off-season workout results, tallied 14 points (2g, 14a) in 38 games. He is tied for the active lead in games played with 114 games of a possible 117. Pollastrone, who has also played in 114 games for UNH, is the Wildcats' top returning goal scorer with 15 goals and 29 points (15g, 14a). He caught fire down the stretch for the Wildcats scoring seven goals in the final four games of the season including a pair in the NCAA Tournament against Notre Dame and five in the Hockey East quarterfinals against Massachusetts. Pollastrone is the active leader in career points with 76 (23g, 15a). Another senior that has battled through injuries and will add depth offensively is granite stater Alan Thompson (Gilford, N.H.). Juniors Bobby Butler (Marlboro, Mass.), Peter LeBlanc (Hamilton, Ontario) and Danny Rossman (Boxford, Mass.) all gained valuable experience in 2007-08 and will be called upon to make an impact once again in 2008-09. Butler enjoyed another fine season a year ago with 26 points (14g, 12a) and is the second leading returning goal scorer with 14 tallies a year ago. Butler was a member of the Hockey East All-Tournament team as he scored a pair of goals in the semifinals against Boston College. LeBlanc more than tripled his offensive productivity from his freshman season with 15 points (5g, 10a) in 37 games. He proved to be a very versatile forward that played center and wing on several different lines during 2007-08. Rossman appeared in three games in 2007-08 and will compete for a spot in the lineup on a more regular basis this season. While the Wildcats have a depth and experience from its juniors and seniors, the sophomore class could be the group called upon to produce in 2008-09. In 2007-08, this group produced 27 percent of the offense, second only to last year's seniors. Among this highly skilled group are the top two returning scorers, James vanRiemsdyk (Middletown, N.J.) and Danny Dries (Lake Orion, Mich.). vanRiemsdyk, the top returning scorer from a year ago, registered 34 points including a team-high 23 assists. He was named to Hockey East's All-Rookie team, was the Hockey East Player of the Month in January and March and a semifinalist for the Walter Brown award. vanRiemsdyk was the team's leader in rookie scoring despite missing four games for the

World Junior Championship. vanRiemsdyk ranked fifth nationally in rookie scoring at 1.0 ppg. Dries was inserted into the Wildcat first line just after the holiday break and helped lead the Wildcat surge into the postseason. He netted 24 of his 28 points after Christmas and his 17 assists are second to vanRiemsdyk among UNH returnees. Dries notched a career-high three assists on Feb. 16 against Providence. Three other sophomores starters were Phil DeSimone (East Amherst, N.Y.), Paul Thompson (Concord, N.H.) and Mike Sislo (Superior, Wis.). DeSimone played in all 38 games and potted three goals and 10 assists for 13 points on the year. DeSimone had three multi-point games and scored his first collegiate goal in a 1-0 win over Merrimack on Jan. 4. Thompson jumped out to a great start as he scored five points (3g, 2a) in a win at Providence on Nov. 17. His five-point effort helped him earn Hockey East Rookie of the Week and Rookie of the Month for November. Sislo skated in all 38 games on the Wildcat third line and recorded eight points (3g, 5a). He netted his first goal on Feb. 1 at Vermont and was one of just two freshmen to play in all 38 games for UNH. Rounding out the returning forwards are Greg Manz (Wayne, Pa.) and Danny Vranek (New Port Richey, Fla.). Manz appeared in seven games for the Wildcats and recorded his first collegiate point on Feb. 1, 2007 with a goal at Vermont. Vranek played in three games and tallied his first-ever collegiate point, netting a goal in his debut on Jan. 6 against St. Lawrence. Freshmen Mike Borisenok (Watervilet, N.Y.), Kevin McCarey (Baldwinsville, N.Y.) and Steve Moses (Leominster, Mass.) will add depth to an already talent-filled offense. Borisenok played his last two seasons with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League (USHL). Last season, the center skated in 46 games and totaled 39 points on 15 goals and 24 assists and was voted Gamblers' Most Valuable Player. McCarey has played his last two seasons with the USA National Development Program. In that time, the forward has skated in 64 games and notched 20 goals and 11 assists, for a total of 31 points. Moses played in 96 games over the last three years for the Junior Bruins of the Eastern Junior Hockey League. In that span, he totaled 96 points on 37 goals and 59 assists and was an all-star selection.

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Wildcats return a wealth of talent on the blueline despite the loss of Hockey East All Stars Brad Flaishans and Craig Switzer. UNH has six defensemen returning including three seniors and four returning starters. Anchoring the group is one of two Wildcat captains and the reigning Old Time Hockey Hockey East Best Defensive Defenseman Joe Charlebois (Potsdam, N.Y.). Charlebois tallied one goal and eight assists for nine points. He also notched a team-best plus/minus rating of +25, including a +7 in the Hockey East quarterfinal series with Massachusetts. Equally touted is senior Jamie Fritsch (Odenton, Md.). Fritsch played in 37 of 38 games, 107 career games, for the Wildcats and led all returning blueliners with four goals last season. While Fritsch is the top returning goal scorer, senior Kevin Kapstad (Boxboro, Mass.) is the top returning point getter among defensemen as he tallied 11 points (3g, 8a) during the 2007-08 campaign. The last of the returning starters is junior Nick Krates (Palos Park, Ill.). Krates was named the team's Most Improved Player in 2007-08. After he played in just one game as a freshman, he saw a significant increase in playing time in 2007-08, playing in 36 games. He tallied his first collegiate point with an assist in the Hockey East semifinals against Boston College at the TD Banknorth Garden and owned a +5 plus/minus rating. Other blueliners seeing time in

2007-08 were Mike Beck (Long Beach, Calif.) and Matt Campanale (Chester Springs, Pa.). Beck made his lone appearance in 2007-08 in the Wildcats' annual "White out the Whitt" game against Maine on Dec. 16, 2007, while Campanale saw action in six games. Two newcomers vying for a spot in the lineup are Blake Kessel (Verona, Wis.) and Damon Kipp (Salmon Arm, B.C.). Kessel, who was selected in the sixth round of the 2007 NHL draft by the New York Islanders, skated in 118 games in the last two seasons for the Waterloo Black Hawks of the USHL. Last season's USHL Defenseman of the Year and an all star selection, Kessel led all defensemen in scoring with 57 points on 19 goals and 38 assists in 59 games. Kipp skated in 169 games in his three-year career for his hometown Salmon Arm Silverbacks of the British Columbia Hockey League (BCHL). Last season the defenseman played in 66 games and tallied 53 points. Among defensemen, Kipp's totals were especially impressive as he ranked third in assists and fourth in total points. In both the 06-07 and the 07-08 seasons the Silverback captain played on the championship winning Team Canada West in the World Junior A Challenge, he served as the team's assistant captain in this year's championship run for the Canada West squad.

NET RESULTS: Replacing one of the University's greatest netminders of all time in Kevin Regan will not be easy. The Wildcats hope to continue in their tradition of great goaltending with junior netminder Brian Foster (Pembroke, N.H.). Foster, a fifth-round draft pick of the Florida Panthers in 2005, entered UNH as one of the most highly touted goaltending recruits in Umile's tenure. Despite seeing limited action over the first two seasons, Foster has performed effectively when called upon and should benefit from playing with more regularity in 2008-09. Foster went 2-2-2 last year with a 3.06 GAA and a .899 save percentage. Foster earned his first ever win over a ranked opponent on Oct. 27, 2007 against No. 4 Colorado College and stopped a career-high 41 shots in a win at Providence on Nov. 17, 2007. Joining Foster between the pipes is a pair of freshmen that could vie for major net time this season in Matt DiGirolamo (Penilyn, Pa.) and Tyler Scott (Ridgefield, Conn.). DiGirolamo played in 75 games over the last two seasons for the Waterloo Black Hawks of the USHL and also helped lead the Blackhawks to the championship game where they lost in overtime. Scott minded the net last season for South Kent Prep of the New England Prep School Athletic Conference. During his senior season at South Kent, Scott helped the Cardinals go 24-9-3 and reach the New England semifinals.

THE PROGRAM'S HISTORY: UNH has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 18 times in the 81-year history of the program. UNH has appeared in the Frozen Four seven times, including national championship game appearances against Maine in 1999 and Minnesota in 2003. UNH earned Hockey East Tournament titles in 2002 and 2003 and regular-season championships in 1997, 1999, 2002, 2003, 2007 and 2008. The Wildcats won the ECAC regular-season title in 1974 and the tournament championship in 1979. UNH has posted 29 seasons with 20-plus wins, including the last 12 consecutive seasons.
